Red Nose Day Friday 15th March 2013

This year Hitchin Boys' School are once again really excited to be raising money for Red Nose Day 2013. As one of the UK's biggest fundraising events, Red Nose Day brings the entire nation together to do something funny for money. In the last two years we have raised over £8,000 for the charity putting Hitchin Boys' School amongst the Top 30 schools in the entire country.

To do our bit and raise money we will be running all sorts of events. To start off the Comic Relief season we have Funny Red Dress Day (FReD day) – on Friday 8th March 2013 boys will pay £ 2.00 each and come dressed in the funniest red clothes they can come up with. Hitchin Boys' School Cycling Club:

Cycling is now one of Britain's most popular leisure pastimes and competitive sports. The success of Team GB on the velodromes around the world and victories amongst in professional cycling has catapulted the sport into the centre of the nation's sporting consciousness. In Great Britain British Cycling is the governing body for cycling and as part of their ongoing development programme British Cycling are keen to encourage the next generation of riders to emulate the success of Wiggins, Pendleton, Cavendish, Cooke and Hoy.

The Go Ride programme is British Cycling's mechanism to develop the sport at grass roots level and is a great way for riders of all ages to learn bike handling and racing skills as well as encouraging people in to exercise.



Hitchin Boys' School (HBS) is working with the local cycling club, Hitchin Nomads CC to kickstart the Go Ride programme in the local area. HBS and Hitchin Nomads will be working closely together over the coming months to run a series of after school clubs (weekdays) and Saturday coaching and racing sessions. The after school clubs and coaching sessions will take place in the school grounds and some of the Saturday activities will also feature guided rides and activities based on the British Cycling Go Ride "Gears" syllabus.

All coaching will be delivered by accredited British Cycling coaches - all of whom volunteer their time and are experienced cyclists, all of whom are also CRB checked.

An after school club will be taking place on Fridays commencing on the 1st of March, the Saturday Go-Ride club will be commencing on the 2nd. Further details will be publicised both in the school and via the learning platform. This is a great opportunity to get in to cycling in a coaching environment and could well lead to HBS alumni featuring on a podium in the near future.

At the moment there is a waiting list for these services but we would encourage you to contact us and we will do our best to arrange an appointment as soon as possible.

Sign up for ParentMail 2

Last September we upgraded to ParentMail 2, a new and improved version of the ParentMail system that we have been using successfully for a couple of years. We now have over 70% of parents registered to receive email messages from school using the system. We are also able to send text messages using ParentMail 2 in an emergency, if parents have also registered a mobile number. 
