NEWS FROM MUSIC

This term has been a really active and exciting one for the school's musicians. Since the success of the school musical, *Sweeney Todd*, just before half term, we have had the music competition and the Spring Concert. The competition was fierce this year and we saw some excellent performances on a wide variety of instruments. The overall Music Cup for 2013 was awarded to Thomas Gimson in Year 13, who also won the Woodwind Cup. The other winners were Daniel Addison (String Cup), James Abrams (Piano Cup), Conor Black (Brass Cup), Timothy Cranfield (Singing Cup), Peter Woodin (Guitar Cup) and Finn Cain (Junior Cup). Thank you to Mr Chambers from HGS and to Mr Brown for adjudicating the competition.

The cups were given out at the Spring concert, where some of the winners performed their pieces as soloists. We also had a show stopping performance on the bagpipes by Alex Hawkins. Once again, the standard of musicians and the number of students taking part, was fantastic to see, so well done to everyone who played or sang.

Musicians also took a leading part in helping to raise money for Comic Relief by playing in the town centre on Red Nose Day. Despite the cold weather, we had performances going on in the market square and the arcade for two hours. Performers included the Brass, Saxophone and Woodwind Groups, Junior and Chamber Choirs, Jazz Band, Street Dancers, Them And Us and Kumara Junction, as well as individual buskers and drama students doing comedy sketches.

Our final performance this term involved members of the Junior Choir taking part in a performance of Bach's *St. Matthew Passion* at the Coptic Centre in Stevenage with the North Herts Guild of Singers and the Orpheus Choir. Our singers represented the school with style and their contribution was much appreciated by the conductor and the choirs.

Finally, many congratulations to Daniel Addison, who won the prestigious Rotary Peter Lambourne Youth Music Bursary, and to James Abrams, who was placed third. They faced fierce competition from musicians from other schools and performed with real credit to themselves and to the school.

Hockey Review

During the season we played 48 matches, won 21, drew 9 and lost 18. Both the Under 14s and Under 16s excelled themselves by reaching the Eastern Regional Finals, as Hertfordshire representatives and performed creditably against the top private schools. The U13 side came 3rd in the County Championships and our 1st XI enjoyed a day out with 27 other schools at the prestigious Weybridge Sixes competition in Surrey. The development of hockey within the school has continued apace. We are very fortunate and grateful to Blueharts Hockey Club who have assisted with the coaching of our players as they have promoted the game and provided our boys with excellent opportunities which we hope will continue for many years to come. Dean Wheeler coached our Year 7 boys on a Thursday evening from September until Christmas with 60 boys regularly attending practice and developing their core skills and tactical awareness. Other coaching sessions were helped by the regular presence of our senior hockey players Andy Smith, Michael Williams, Sam Rees and Andy Munn who supported the younger teams on a weekly basis through coaching and umpiring. Paul Buckland, the Blueharts 1st team captain, coached our 1st XI and U16 with success and they are a side who show great promise for the future. Many thanks too, must go to both Geoff Edwards and Mike Tipper for umpiring our home matches thus allowing our staff to coach from the sidelines.
