- If you don't get the GCSE grades you wanted, you must come and speak with a member of the Sixth Form Team to discuss your options.
- For the first time at HBS, Y12 are completing a period of work experience. We hope that they have had an insight into the world of work and that this may help them make decisions about their lives post-HBS.



Results Days

We are pleased that, for the first time in quite a while, we will be able to have normal exam results days.

Students are welcome onsite from 9am to get the results of their A Levels (Thursday, 18th August) or their GCSEs (Thursday, 25th August).

Members of the Sixth Form Team will be around to speak with students regarding the outcomes, be that congratulating them, or helping them decide on their next steps.
