Dear Parents/Carers of Year 11

You will, I hope, forgive me for opening with "And now, the end is near"; it seemed particularly apt as we have only 28 school days before the exam season begins in earnest. We kick things off with the first public exam, Art, taking place on May 1st and 2nd, and the last on June 18th, Timbers (or Resistant Materials in old money).

Friday 24th May 2024:

Long, languid days of early mass study leave are proscribed by the DfE, therefore the Year 11 students will officially be released from lessons on May 24th. In the three weeks prior to this there will be a timetable of intervention and exam preparation sessions, Mr Dawson will be in touch with further information around this.

Monday 24th – Wednesday 26th June:

Those who intend to return here for Sixth Form are expected to attend on these three dates for Induction; they will attend preliminary lessons and be given their bridging work for the Summer.

Friday 28th June:

Founders' Day celebrations. Year 13 and Year 11 students are invited to attend in their finest uniform - think firmly pressed white shirts and ties and trousers with razor creases! They are to congregate from 10:15am in North Court and will then process through the school, cheered on by the lower school students, to St Mary's Church for a Service of Thanksgiving. I think it to be a wonderful tradition and I hope you will encourage your child to be there too.
