

# **Year 13 Destinations Report 2022**

As in previous years this summer there was the usual scenario of some past students continuing to be supported by the school in addition to the outgoing Year 13 students. In total there were 136 students in the cohort, with additional past students who were supported by the sixth form pastoral team.

#### Of these 136 students:

Two were from previous cohorts and 134 were from the 2021-22 outgoing Year 13 cohort.

### <u>Overal</u>I:

103 students secured a place at University or Music College. However, eight of these have deferred their place until Sept 2023, meaning 95 HBS students are starting courses in Sept/Oct 2022. Of these 95 students, 93 were from the 2021-22 cohort – so 69% going on to degree standard education in 2022; 75% going on to degree standard education including those who have deferred to 2023. At the time of writing, seven students had applied to university but were not placed and are not included in these figures. Of the total number who secured a place, 31 students are going to a Russell Group University (30%).

## Of the students who did not gain a place at university this year or did not apply:

- 7 students have applied for/are planning to apply for apprenticeships.
- 22 students are taking gap years.
- One student has set up his own freelance music company and one is a trainee consultant at Hunter Jones Group.

#### Degree choices:

Of the 103 students who secured a place at University or Music College this year:

- 33 degrees are in the STEM subjects.
- Business degrees were the most popular with 20 (including marketing, accounting, finance and management). 13 students are pursuing creative degrees (film, TV, communication, media, music, fashion, graphic design).
- More unusual degrees being studied by this year's students include Air Transport Studies with Pilot Licence, Animal Management, Dental Hygiene, Fashion Design, German and Russian, Science and Football and Neuroscience.
